Colonel Charles Waterhouse, USMCR

Colonel Charles Waterhouse, USMCR, was the first and only artist-in-residence of the U.S. Marine Corps. A lifelong New Jersey resident, Col. Waterhouse enlisted in the Marine Corps during World War II. He was seriously wounded during the first wave at Iwo Jima and suffered nerve damage that caused him to lose the feeling in most of his left hand, but there was no damage to the hand that would become his painting hand. After the war, he married the love of his life, Barbara Andersen. He built a reputation as an illustrator for Outdoor Life, Reader's Digest, Rutgers Press and the Boy Scouts. He also served three tours of duty as a combat artist in Vietnam. In 1973, Col. Waterhouse was brought back to active duty. He painted 160 major works covering every campaign in the history of the Corps, from its birth through Operation Iraqi Freedom. In his final years, Colonel Waterhouse embarked on a series of paintings chronicling the USMC and Naval Medal of Honor recipients. Colonel Waterhouse through his brush and his artist's eye left a legacy that honors all Marines and will live on forever.

Guest of Honor Captain Fred Williamson USMC



Since graduating from Wagner College in 1964, Fred Williamson ('64, H'11) has been a constant presence within the Seahawk Athletic Department, contributing to his alma mater as a passionate supporter and leader of various committees and boards. The Red Bank, NJ native was a three-year football letter winner and captain of the 1963 team, in addition to competing on the Seahawks' Track & Field team. Following his graduation, he served his country as a Marine Corps officer. During his two-year tour of duty in Vietnam as an infantry Platoon and Company Commander, he received two Silver Stars medals for "conspicuous gallantry" and "bravery in action," and a Purple Heart for wounds received in combat. For over 20 years, Williamson served as a Wagner Board of Trustee Member and was honored with the inaugural Kevin Sheehy NAA Alumni Leadership Medal, presented to an individual who has demonstrated leadership and service to the Wagner College Alumni Association.
